# We Three Kings

This year, the Feast of the Epiphany occurs on Saturday, January 6<sup>th</sup>. The gospel reading on that day recalls the visit of the three wise men to the Baby Jesus. In Greek, the term for wise men is "magi." Matthew is the only one of the gospels that includes this story (2:1-12).

There is actually no mention of the number - but we have concluded that there were three, given that they offered three gifts to the newborn Savior. From tradition, the three wise men were Melchior (from Persia), Caspar (from India), and Balthazar (from Arabia).

We all know the gifts - gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold was an indication of Christ's kingship on earth, frankincense was a symbol of a deity, and myrrh was a spice symbolizing suffering. Myrrh was also a spice used to embalm. The last gift that would make anyone uncomfortable, but it predicted that this Baby Jesus would someday die sacrificially for us all.

The arrival of the three magi or wise men was prophesied in Psalm 72:11: "May all kings fall down before him." Clearly, the wise men were led by faith to Jesus. May we all be led to and stay at the feet of Jesus, our Savior. [Taken from Introduction to the New Testament by daSilva]

# Dancing With God (unknown)

When I meditated on the word Guidance, I kept seeing "dance" at the end of the word.

I remember reading that doing God's will is a lot like dancing. When two people try to lead, nothing feels right.

The movement doesn't flow with the music, and everything is quite uncomfortable and jerky. When one person realizes that, and lets the other lead, both bodies begin to flow with the music. One gives gentle cues, perhaps with a nudge to the back or by pressing lightly in one direction or another. It's as if two become one body, moving beautifully! The dance takes surrender, willingness, and attentiveness from one person and gentle guidance and skill from the other.
