While meditating on each week's readings, I often find myself uncovering the meaning for a particular word. Sometimes, this word is foundational to the readings. Exploring the word more deeply helps bolster the power of the readings for that week.

Well for this month's message, I was drawn to the word "picnic." No, you won't find it in any of our lectionary readings for August. But you will find it in the newsletter!

Our Annual Parish Picnic is Sunday - August 5th - at 10:30 am at Columbia Woods Park in Norton. Please see the item in this month's newsletter for more information. Come, and invite your family and friends, too. OK, now back to the word picnic....

The word "picnic" can find its origins in the French language: pique nique. Some thought that "picnic" combined two words that meant to peck at some of little importance! Well, that doesn't describe our current use of the word.

The English "Anglicized" the word into our present-day "picnic." According to British letters from the 17th century, the word became known as a gathering of family and friends where folks brought a variety of foods. It was important to gather at a place with little distractions, where the group could enjoy each other's company.

Well, there you have it! That's what we think of when hearing the word "picnic."

And you know, it's also what I think of when I think of Saint Andrew's. Our church is a warm and welcoming place where folks pause from daily life, gather together away from the distractions, bring their many gifts, and are fed by God's Word and the Eucharist.


