Dear Friends in Christ,

On Sunday, November 4th we'll celebrate the Feast Day of All Saints'. It's one of the major holy days in our church. At both services, we'll remember, by name, our loved ones who have gone on to their greater glory. We'll also welcome C. J. Friedrichsen into the household of God through the sacrament of baptism at the 10 am service.

The Feast of All Saints' Day is when we remember the communion of saints. Sure - we'll remember our family and friends, along with the "big names" in sainthood. Folks like the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint John, Saint Teresa of Avila, and Saint Benedict.

But we also remember the little-known saints, too, who have worked to build up Christ's kingdom. Someone like Saint Kateri Tekawitha, also known as the Lily of the Mohawks. She was the first Native American person canonized a saint, born in modern-day New York in 1656.

Not long after birth, her parents died in a smallpox epidemic. The disease also left her with very poor eyesight. As a result, she was given the nickname - Tekawitha, which means "she who bumps into things." How would you like to be known as someone who did that!

After moving to Canada, Saint Kateri Tekawitha died of tuberculosis at the age of 24. She is venerated as the Protectress of Canada, as well as the patron saint of Native American people and ecology.

As a Christ-follower, it's difficult. Sometimes, we bump into things on our Christian journey. Many of us could have the nickname Tekawitha. But know that - like Saint Kateri Tekawitha - we're given God's love and care for the journey.

May you feel God's love during this month of November and in the days to come.

Special Eucharist from 1892 Book on Common Prayer

In recognition of the Feast Day of Saint Andrew (on November 25), we'll have a Service of Holy Eucharist from the 1892 Book of Common Prayer - the prayer book that was used when our church was founded. The order of some things is different, and the responses are different (but similar to our Rite I service). It should be a memorable day - so we hope to see you there!

Saint Andrew's Day (Information collected from A Calendar of Saints by James Bentley)

Saint Andrew began as a follower of Saint John the Baptist. After John's arrest, Andrew returned to the Sea of Galilee, fishing with his brother, Simon Peter. It was there that they met Jesus, who called him by these famous words, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men (Matthew 4:19)."

Immediately, Saint Andrew knew that he had met someone special. Saint John's gospel records that it was Andrew that first declared, "We have found the Messiah (John 1:41)." For the rest of Jesus' ministries, Andrew was usually near - humbly listening, watching, and/or following.

Saint Andrew was also one of growing faith. After 5,000 had followed Jesus, it was Andrew that took the few fish and bread loaves to Jesus to bless and distribute. We know the "rest of the story" as Jesus fed everyone with food leftover! After Jesus' Resurrection and Ascension, Andrew is said to have traveled through Greece and was crucified in the year 60 AD.

Icons and other religious pictures of Saint Andrew often show him standing in front of the X-shaped cross on which he was crucified. In nearly every depiction, he is holding a Bible or scroll of scripture, demonstrating the ultimate importance that the Word of God held in his life.

Collect for Saint Andrew

Almighty God, who gave such grace to your apostle Andrew that he readily obeyed the call of your Son Jesus Christ, and brought his brother with him: Give us, who are called by your Holy Word, grace to follow him without delay, and to bring those near to us into his gracious presence; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. (BCP p. 237)

Monthly Readings for Holy Days

Did you know, every month, we include some saints and other days of celebration on our monthly calendar. We also include the scriptural readings associated with each saint day. This month's list includes a number of interesting folks. Here are a few quick facts about them:

- +Richard Hooker (November 3), an English bishop living in the 16th century, was credited with advancing a theology which connected Catholicism and Protestantism, coining the "via media" or middle way.
- +Saint Martin of Tours (November 12) was aptly-named, as he was born in Hungary, spent his childhood in Italy, and lived most of his adulthood in France.
- +King Kamehameha IV and Queen Emma of Hawaii (November 27), were friends of English Queen Victoria and helped establish the Episcopal Church (originally called the Hawaii Reformed Catholic Church) in Hawaii in 1862.
